- ALL: **Please** do not enter the kitchen if you are wearing fragrance, remain in the commons area.

- ALL SECONDARY: Students are not allowed on the playground toys at lunchtime. Students should be only in the gym or commons, **and be visible to the supervisor.**

- ALL: Students are not allowed to be on the upper playground prior to school starting without adult supervision.
