- ALL STUDENTS AND STAFF: A friendly reminder – the only beverage allowed in the gym at ANYTIME is water. All other forms of beverage must be consumed outside the gym. Thank you for your help with this.
- ALL SECONDARY: Students are not allowed on the playground toys at lunchtime. Students should be only in the gym or commons, **and be visible to the supervisor**.
- ALL: Students are not allowed to be using the weight room without adult one-on-one supervision.
- ALL: Students are not allowed to be on the upper playground prior to school starting without adult supervision.
- ALL SECONDARY: Payment of ASB dues are *required for participation in athletics, FFA, FBLA and some ASB activities*. Make sure yours are taken care of soon!
