

## LEVY BALLOT INFORMATION

We are less than a week away from our February 10 replacement levy election. If you have not already returned your ballot, please do so and encourage your family, friends, and neighbors to vote as well. If you or someone you know whose ballot was lost, delayed, or never delivered, take the following steps to ensure your vote is counted:

- Confirm your voter registration at [VoteWA.gov](https://VoteWA.gov).
- Request a replacement ballot through [VoteWA.gov](https://VoteWA.gov) or by contacting the Grant County Elections Office at **509-754-2011 Ext. 2777**.
- Print a replacement ballot directly from [VoteWA.gov](https://VoteWA.gov), then follow the instructions to return it.
- Return your ballot by mail or at an official ballot drop box (see locations below) by the election deadline.

**The Grant County Elections Office has confirmed that lost or undelivered ballots are a statewide issue during this election cycle.**

Additionally, if you plan to return your ballot through the U.S. Postal Service, it must be postmarked by Election Day, February 10, and received by the county elections office. Due to changes in how mail is processed and postmarked, ballots mailed close to Election Day may not receive a timely postmark. To help ensure your ballot is counted, I recommend **mailing it no later than Friday, February 6.**

You may also return your ballot directly to an official ballot drop box. A Grant County drop **box is located behind the county shop at 124 Railroad St.** All drop boxes remain open until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
